

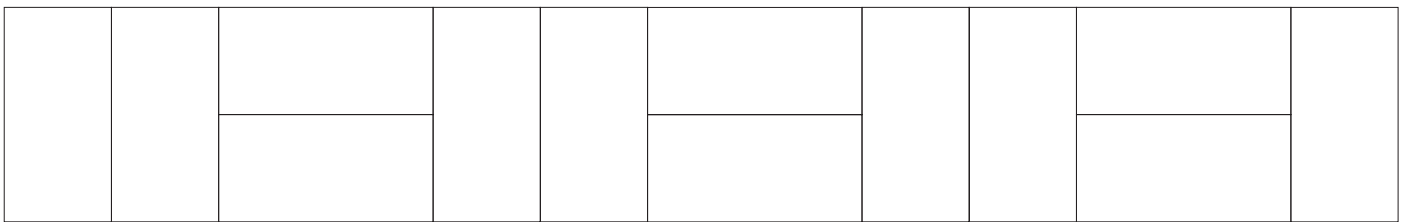
Super Scrappy Quilt

To make a quilt 65" x 65" (1.65 x 1.65) you need (78) 5½" x 10½" rectangles of assorted fabrics.

Or cut (1) 5½" strip (the full width of the fabric) of (20) different fabrics.
Cut each strip into (4) 5½" x 10½" rectangles.

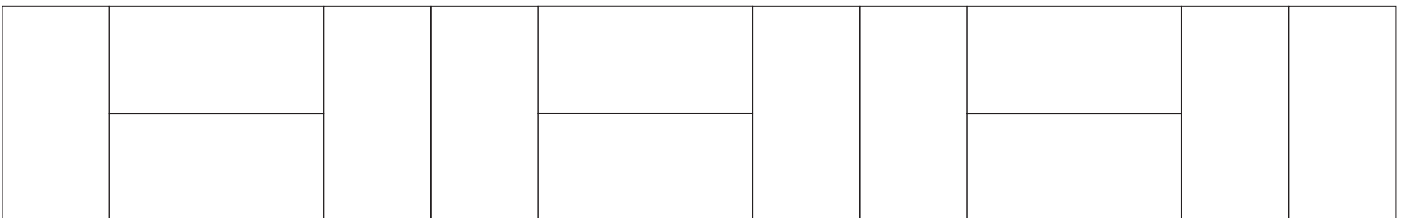
Using a ¼" seam throughout sew (36) blocks of (2) 5½" x 10½" rectangles together on the long side. You can chain piece these for quickness.

Make (6) rows of six blocks as per diagram alternating the direction of each block and ending the row with a single 5½" x 10½" rectangle. Begin each row with the rectangles in the block placed vertically. See diagram below.



Sewing the rows.

Begin the first row with a block consisting of (2) 5½ x 10½" rectangles. See diagram above. Flip the 2nd row so it begins with the single 5½ x 10½" rectangle. See diagram below. Continue alternating the rows till you have sewn six rows.



Finishing the Quilt.

I used a Moda blanket that measured 66" x 90". You could make your quilt bigger if you wanted to use the whole blanket or use the remainder of the blanket to make some cushions.

Centre the quilt top right sides together with the blanket and sew all around the edge leaving an opening to turn it through.

Trim off any excess blanket. Turn through, handstitch the opening closed and press.

Blanket stitch around the edge using large stitches and 3 strands of embroidery thread.
